# Season of Easter



Welcome to the season of Easter (or Eastertide).

Eastertide is a 50-day season lasting from Easter until the feast of Pentecost. It lasts 50 days because after the resurrection, Jesus spent forty days on earth before he ascended, and then there were ten more days after that before the Day of Pentecost (the day the Holy Spirit descended onto the followers of Jesus).

During this time we reflect on what it means to live with resurrection hope *now*. We also practice being attentive to glimpses of resurrection light in our daily lives. Celebrating Easter does not mean that we no longer have doubts, fear, or sadness in our lives, or that there isn't a place for them (there most certainly is). Rather, it means learning to anchor ourselves in God's dream —— a dream of wholeness, peace, and complete belonging for *everybody*.
