March Trinity Topics, 2025

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

These are the words that we hear on Ash Wednesday as ashes are smeared on our foreheads. Our Lenten season begins with a chance for us to consider our mortality. And while this is can seem dark or difficult, as Christians we can actually find it freeing. We know the story: that death is not the end but is followed by resurrection and new life. And so we are able to hold the heaviness of death on Ash Wednesday and through the season of Lent, and allow it to help mold us and prepare us for resurrection.

Traditionally, the season of Lent was a time of preparation for those who were to be baptized and a time of repentance and penitence for those who had left the church. It was a time to internally prepare for that which was to come. And though the church has changed over the last 2000 years, we still use this as a season of internal preparation. During the Ash Wednesday Service I will say these words:

I invite you, therefore, in the name of the church, to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word.

Please know that this time of Lent is set aside *for you*. There is no obligation in the Episcopal church to do or not do anything during this season. What I do hope is that you will find something that feeds your soul and deepens your relationship with God. This might include fasting or self-denial. But it might also include a daily prayer ritual, or time set aside to read scripture. It might even just be a daily walk to appreciate the world that God has given us. Lent is a time for us to slow down and remember the things that are really important for us.

To help support you, I will be doing a short education series on the Wednesdays in Lent on Tools for Prayer. This will take place at 7pm in the sanctuary beginning March 12, and will be followed by a service of Evening Prayer. It will also be streamed and saved on our YouTube channel so that you can partake at your own leisure. I hope that it helps support your Lenten journey.

Each staff day will include an hour of drop-in fellowship and conversation from 10 to 11 am. Following lunch, all traveling staff members are available by appointment for conversation. If you would like to meet our current leadership at the Diocese, please come to visit.

OUTREACH/SOCIAL MINISTRY

The Outreach/Social Ministry Committee is sponsoring a project at Garden Manor Apartments in Troy. In 1978, Garden Manor Apartments were built with the leadership and financial support of 8 churches in Troy. Trinity Episcopal Church was one of the founding churches. The 66 units at Garden Manor provide housing for low-income families. The complex receives HUD funding and is currently managed by Oberer Management, but is also overseen by a Board of Churches, the THOU board, or Troy Housing Opportunities United. Trinity is a member of this board. Our congregation has been linked with Garden Manor since its inception.

A new laundry room was recently opened for the residents of Garden Manor. In honor of our long affiliation with these apartments, we propose to assemble laundry starter kits for the residents, consisting of a laundry bag, laundry pods, dryer sheets, and scent booster. We have been approved for a small grant from Thrivent to help purchase the laundry bags. We are asking the congregation to help by donating the laundry items, laundry pods, dryer sheets, and scent booster. A laundry basket to hold these donations will be placed by the side door leading to the Parish Hall beginning March 9th.

We plan to put the kits together after services on March 30th in the Parish Hall.
